

L'Herminie

Bermuda's most impressive warship wreck is the L'Herminie, a 60 gun French warship that sank in 1838. This three-masted, wooden hulled sailing vessel was returning to France from a skirmish in Mexico when she crashed into a reef. Approximately some 25 giant cannons remain scattered across the sea floor, partially buried in the sand.

In depths of 25-30 feet, visitors can see the ship's timbers, hull sheathing, copper nails, the terra cotta bricks used as ovens and a pair of crossed cannons that serve as a monument to this unique wreck site.

L'Herminie was one of the last French fighting ships that used sail power before European powers switched to steam.
